About the roles

Poultry Farming Expert (International)

We are looking for an international poultry farming expert to lead the design and delivery of a combination of classroom-based and hands-on (including on-farm) training modules to smallholder poultry farmers. Training will focus on good agricultural practices, climate-smart farm management, supply chain understanding, maintenance of farm equipment, building and environment, and market linkages. The work will be intermittent and involve conducting a training needs assessment, developing a training strategy and modular training content, and conducting training of trainers.

Required expertise and experience

- Master's degree or equivalent in poultry science, agricultural economics, environmental
 management, or other related fields. A university degree in the above with relevant professional
 experience can be considered.
- Experience developing and delivering training programs to smallholder farmers in the poultry farming sector.
- Experience delivering training to women poultry farmers. Experience in gender equity and or delivering gender sensitization training in the sector would be an asset.
- Experience integrating climate change adaptive measures with smallholder poultry farmers.
- Experience and familiarity with poultry production in Cambodia or other leading countries with developing poultry sectors is preferable.

Maize Agronomist/Expert (International)

We are looking for a maize expert/agronomist to lead the design and delivery of a combination of classroom-based and hands-on (including on-farm) training modules to smallholder maize farmers. Training will focus on good agricultural practices, climate-smart farm management, maintenance of farm equipment, building, and environment, supply chain understanding, and market linkages. The work will be intermittent and involve conducting a training needs assessment, developing a training strategy and modular content, and conducting training of trainers.

Financial Literacy Expert (International)

We are looking for a financial literacy expert to lead the design and delivery of a training program in farm budget management and functional financial literacy for smallholder maize and poultry farmers in Cambodia. The training program will cover key topics such as farm budget management, including calculating profit, utilising savings with credit, understanding contracts, banking electronically, and the importance of market linkages and understanding of supply chains. The work will be intermittent and involve conducting a training need assessment and developing and delivering a training program.

Required expertise and experience.

- Master's degree or equivalent in the area of financial literacy, agricultural economics, or other related fields.
- Over 10 years of experience in the field of financial literacy in the developing world.
- Experience and a good understanding of agricultural economics are a must.
- Prior experience in organising training sessions for women.
- Experience delivering training to women maize farmers. Experience in gender equity and or delivering gender sensitization training in the sector would be an asset.
